Changes to Parking Enforcement. Parking wardens to patrol the area

From the 9th October 2017 Wokingham Borough Council is in charge of parking enforcement (CPE), taking over the powers from the Police.



The parking wardens can punish careless drivers who obstruct busy roads with their unruly parking and they will also have the power to punish drivers who park on **double and single yellow lines, double park, park across dropped kerbs, park opposite road junctions and those who stop on "school keep clear" markings.**

Councillor Chris Bowring, executive member for highways and transport and the council said: "Our utmost priority when taking over parking enforcement is to ensure drivers, pedestrians and cyclists can access our borough safely. Illegal and inconsiderate parking can cause hazards for emergency services, other road users and pedestrians".
