REOPENING OF BROAD STREET DELAYED

DUE TO UNFORESEEABLE ISSUES UNCOVERED IN TOWN CENTRE

The road was due to open at the end of this month but the volume of issues underground that have needed to be repaired and rectified has, unfortunately, meant this needs to be put back.



The road is now expected to reopen during March.

ROAD WORKS

M4 Junction 10 Bridge Maintenance Update

The scheme has encountered significant difficulties due to unforeseen ground conditions found on site in 2017. These issues were predominantly caused by solid concrete being found rather than lightly compacted material.

This led to extensive problems with the piling operations on this scheme, which meant we have had to re-design aspects of the scheme. The changes made have had to allow both the works to continue and ensure the safety of road users whilst mitigating delays by keeping the links to/from the M4 open.

We currently anticipate that the scheme should now be completed in **mid-March 2018**. However, we hope to improve on this date by carrying out a review on remaining activities.



NEW PEDESTRIAN CROSSING to be installed near the Forest School

Pupils at Forest School will be able to cross the road safely soon after it was announced Wokingham Borough Council will be installing a pedestrian crossing next month on Robinhood Lane, Winnersh.

In order to carry out the improvements, Robinhood Lane will be closed from Reading Road to the Arbour Lane junction and a diversion put in place.

The works have been scheduled to take place over the February half term (February 12 to 16) between 09:30am and 4:30pm to minimise disruption.

THE STRAIGHT MILE, HURST

The Straight Mile, Hurst between its junctions with B3018 The Straight Mile and B3034 Forest Road, will be closed from 29 January until 9 February between 22.00 and 05.30 hours.

During daylight hours, temporary traffic signals will be in operation

The reason for this prohibition is allow Highways England/Kier contractors to undertake essential bridge expansion joint replacement work in safety.

The alternative route for all vehicles affected by this restriction shall be via B3034 Forest Road, B3018 Church Lane, B3018 Twyford Road and B3018 The Straight Mile, or by this route in reverse.

Access for residents / businesses within the boundary of the restriction will be maintained at all times.

The restriction imposed by the Order shall only apply during those periods when traffic signs complying with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 are lawfully displayed.
