“Fly Tipping will never be tolerated”

WOKINGHAM MAN FINED £1,500 FOR DUMPING GREEN WASTE

Nicol Handyside, 70, of Emmbrook Road, Wokingham has been convicted for fly tipping offences after pleading guilty to dumping green waste.

Handyside, a self-employed gardener, had been seen dumping tree cuttings and green waste from his van by a passer-by at a lay-by on Twyford Road, Wokingham.

He admitted to the offence during a voluntary interview at a police station, calling it a stupid error. He claimed that he needed his green waste bags emptied for his next job, and decided to dispose of the waste at the side of the road.

At court, Handyside pleaded guilty to the ‘fly tipping’ offence and was fined £665 and ordered to pay a victim surcharge of £66 and costs of £807.45.

Cllr Norman Jorgensen, executive member for environment, sports, environmental health, leisure and libraries, said: “No matter what the waste, or the reasons behind it, fly tipping will never be tolerated and will be dealt with accordingly by the council. I hope that the outcome of this case acts as a deterrent to others.

re3 scoops top design and technology award at

Awards for Excellence in Recycling and Waste Management



re3 partnership was awarded the ‘Best use of design and technology in a waste management facility’ at the prestigious Let’s Recycle’s 2018 **Awards for Excellence in Recycling and Waste Management** gala event, held in London. The panel of judges recognised re3 for its efforts to increase the amount of waste that is reused, recycled and composted, especially noting the recent investment to the Material Recycling Facility (MRF) in Reading that enhanced its plastic recycling capability.

At the beginning of this year, re3 seamlessly completed the enhancement to the Smallmead Material Recycling Facility which resulted in widening the range of items accepted from the kerbside, including plastic pots, tubs and trays in addition to the previously collected materials. The investment included an upgrade to the MRF facility that allows it to sort the new materials cost effectively and to a very high standard, in the same way as the other materials that re3 is currently recycling.

Cllr Norman Jorgensen, Wokingham Borough Council’s Executive Member for Environment, added: “We are delighted with this award, it shows that the entire waste industry has recognised and praised the enhancements led by the re3 Councils and undertaken by FCC Environment to improve recycling for our residents, especially plastic materials.”
