

“The Elizabeth Line”




Construction of the Elizabeth line is now in its final stages. Testing of the new trains and infrastructure is underway and continues alongside the remaining fit-out of the stations.

41 stations from Reading and Heathrow to Shenfield and Abbey Wood in the East

All of the permanent track has been installed and the new Elizabeth line trains are currently being tested using the line's new automatic train control system (ATCS), which operates in the central section of the route

There is a national movement to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the ending of the First World War by towers ringing their bells open (not muffled) at **12:30pm on November 11th**.

We would love St Nicholas Church to take part in this national movement of commemoration of the end of WW1, but to enable this to happen we need some extra people who would be prepared to commit sometime between now and the 11th November to learn how to bell ring to enable the bells at St Nicholas to be rung. Anyone from the age of 13 to 75 years can take part.

Most people can be taught to handle a bell in under 10 hours, and hope that we could achieve ringing together in the simplest way with a further 10 or so hours.

Please find below a press release on launching new re3cyclopedia mobile app that aims to help residents of Bracknell Forest, Reading and Wokingham Borough to recycle more and recycle right. re3cyclopedia is free and can be downloaded from [App Store](#) or [Google Play Store](#).



Key features include:

- Waste item search – residents following adding their postcode can search for any items to see whether these can be recycled/composted/brought to the recycling centres or place to rubbish bin.
- The app will show the closest recycling sites ie bottle or textile banks.
- Information about re3 recycling centres (opening hours, directions, web cams)
- Councils waste information (collection dates, information about garden waste, bulky waste collection etc.
