The bunting, made up of the Poster competitions entries, is now up on the St Nicholas School railings.


You can **buy your ticket now on the PTA** website for the BBQ and the cream tea.

developers making it clear that we object to their proposal. A letter has also been sent to Theresa May. All information available to date (and both letters) are on the <u>HVS website</u>.


Other Planning
