The latest news is that sales at the shop are up, but no final decision has been made. Use It or Lose It. The good news is that the outside of the shop has just been painted.

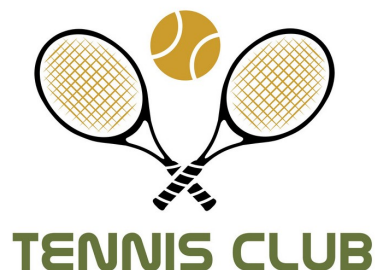


Tennis at Dolphin School

Planning & Other Hurst News

Neighbourhood Plan

As reported in the last HVS newsletter, the Parish Council resolved in April to suspend work on the Neighbourhood Plan other than to continue to update potential evidence and information data. At the time, the original terms of reference had expired automatically after 5 years.

The Parish Council formally adopted new terms of reference for the Neighbourhood Plan at its meeting on May 30th. Unauthorised Access onto Lodge Road prevented

Local residents noticed work being undertaken to remove a hedge and create a large gate into a site on Lodge Road. This was reported to WBC and HVS. Thanks to Councillor Wayne Smith and his WBC colleagues for reacting quickly.

New Community Hub

The HPC are planning a new Community Hub for the village on the site of the existing Scout Hut.



This is discussed regularly at the monthly Parish Council meetings. As noted in the [HPC April minutes](#), the Chairman reported that he had to arrange a meeting with the Hurst Village Halls and the Scout Group to discuss the draft plans. Once these discussions have taken place plans will be circulated for further discussions. The HPC Chairmans' [Annual Report 22/23](#) notes that the HPC are currently engaging with Architects who are drawing up plans for consideration.
